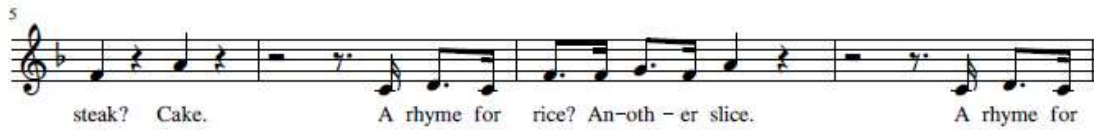
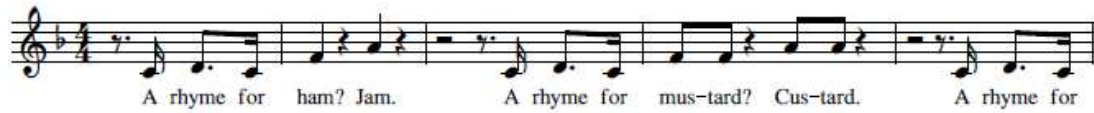


A Rhyme for Ham

About the Music:

Activities:

2. Sing or say rhyme with Dan and imitate his voice.
3. Clap beat with the string quartet.
4. Find new clapping patterns to go with the song.
5. Clap, stamp, jump or hop on the rhyming word.
6. Create new phrases for which you can find rhyming words.
